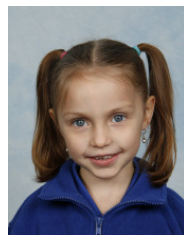
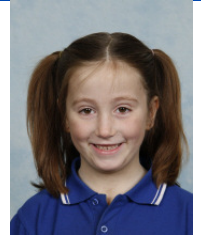

## Students Sharing Their Individual Learning Focus

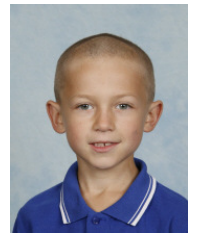
### P1P Izzy
